




During a January 2024 visit to the African American Cultural Museum at Loray Mills, SJJ students participated in a Zoom event with retired NASA scientist Dr. Lonnie Reid.

The SJJ staff helps students with reading and mathematics each afternoon, attempting to close below-grade-level gaps. In Clover School District, i-Ready is an online program used to measure student growth in reading and mathematics and provide students with a pathway of remediation and enrichment activities to help mitigate deficiencies. We are excited to report that on the most recent i-Ready diagnostic, SJJ students grew by an average of 37 points in reading and 27 points in mathematics. Great work, SJJEC students and staff!
